
Training the Next Generation of Medical Researchers

Trainees are exposed to medical research settings and are empowered to conduct research in their chosen specialty.

The rotation builds a foundation of best research practices by navigating trainees through each stage of the research process. It begins with trainees designing a research project before moving on to gathering data, analyzing results, and submitting research for publication or presentation.

Opportunities for Authorship

The research publishes 20-30 articles per year. This provides students with the opportunity to join as coauthors of ongoing research, publish their own research, or present their research at a national medical conference.



As part of the research process, the rotation includes ethics-focused lectures on topics such as:

- PRISM
- HIPPA
- Human research subjects
